The plan is to replace the many separate, and often incompatible computer systems operating in Visteon with an integrated system that will standardize our core business processes across the entire organization. But that's just the start. With ERP we can all talk together, use the same informa-

tion, and—this is really important—we can get exact answers to all of our information requests immediately.



So if this is so slick, why haven't we done this earlier and why does it seem to take so long to get going now?

Well, it sounds easier than it is. The decision to start an ERP program takes a lot of planning. Look at the number of computers and functions we have to organize. Finance has a lot, as does manufacturing, purchasing, engineering and sales. Plus, we've got them in the U.S., France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Mexico, Brazil and so forth. Whoops, how do we get the ones that speak Spanish or French to talk with the ones in Germany or the U.S.—they don't speak the same

language? In fact, how can our sales team in Germany sell bumpers to a French carmaker and ship them from the U.S.? Are they costed in marks, francs or dollars? How does manufacturing get the order, logistics send the shipment, sales enter the order, accounting send the bill?

### **SAP Software**

Well, ERP will take care of all that. We chose SAP AG as the software company to supply us with ERP computer applications. Why SAP? It's one of the largest makers of this type of software. Major automotive suppliers and manufacturers such as Lear, DaimlerChrysler, BMW, Volkswagen, Tenneco, Delphi, and Renault just to name a few, are using it. SAP (which stands for Systems, Applications and Products) produces all sorts of software for a lot of different types of companies. The integrated
